#### SAT

As a reminder, the school day SAT is on Thursday, March 6th for all juniors. This is a mandatory test and it is digital, so students will need their fully-charged iPads. More information will be sent closer to the test date.

**BCHS SAT Course**: If you want to take this course, <u>sign-up using this link</u>. The class is Wednesday nights from 6-8pm for 6 weeks starting January 29th. It fills up fast! The cost is \$150. This is the only in-person SAT course we offer here at BCHS so I encourage you to sign-up if you are able! Khan Academy is also a great (free) online resource for students to prepare for the SAT!.



I encourage students to make a testing plan. If you are applying for highly selective schools or programs, you might want to give yourself multiple chances to take the SAT. It is only offered a <u>few times a semester</u> so it might be good to plan which tests you'll take before the big November 1st college application deadline next fall. We only sign students up for the school-day SAT in March, so it will be the student's responsibility to sign-up for additional Saturday SATs or ACTs. Colleges do not care which test you take (SAT or ACT), so take whatever one you prefer.

**Decide if you want to use your "free score sends":** Before you take the SAT, you will complete a "digital readiness check" here at school. During this, you can choose to use your "4 free score sends." This means, you would choose 4 schools to receive your scores and you won't have to pay to send your scores to that school later. You will not see your score before it is sent. You could wait to send the scores until after the test, but you will have to pay \$15 per school.

Pros of Using Free Score Sends	Cons of Using Free Score Sends
Don't have to pay the \$15/school after the test to send score reports	You don't get to see your score before you submit it
Don't have to go through the extra hassle of sending your scores to colleges because it's sent automatically	Once a school has your score, you can't "unsend" it and you don't know how they will use that score.
Most schools superscore, so they will take your best scores anyway. Though, you'd be assuming you'll do better next time for them to be able to superscore.	Every school has different test score policies. If you don't know their policy, it might not help you to send the score if you get below the school's average

**Example 2024 Test Score Policies**: Purdue; IU & Kelley Business School; Ball State; Miami; UK (no harm policy); Dayton; Cincinnati


## **Goals of this Spring Semester**

Check the main page of Scoir for "assignments" to help keep you on track! It should look something like this:




## **College Athletics**

If you are interested in playing college athletics, they will need either a NCAA Eligibility Account (for Division I or II) or a NAIA Account, before the end of junior year and ideally sooner than that. They should let their counselor know of their interest in athletics when they schedule their courses this year. They also need to complete the records release form so that the counseling office has permission to send transcripts to coaches who reach out.
