#### WHAT TO BRING TO MINI-CAMP REHEARSALS

# - your positive and cheery disposition and "ready to dig-in" attitude

While many of you are veterans of the *Band*, the old, *Liturgy Choir* and *Sounds of Silas* (A Cappella), and the newly branded, *Vox Troiano*, we have a number of new members in our midst who are in need of a community of new friends and colleagues. We also need to lift each other up in our collective work ethic and musicianship. Remember to "be as smart as you are" when it comes to your artistry and not be afraid to stretch out with your musical gift.

#### your instrument

Whether your bringing your vocal instrument (voice, Vox) or your mechanical instrument (band, orchestra instruments), make sure it is in good, working condition.

Singers, take care drink plenty of water and get good rest between now and next Monday and between rehearsals. Try not to shout or scream.

Band members, check that your instrument is in good working order. Clean, grease/oil, and play it to ensure it's ready to go for that first day of rehearsal. Nobody wants to show up ready to play and have to endure a lengthy repair or a scramble to find a solution. Woodwind players, a limited amount of reeds are available in my office for you - just ask.
